3	 Vice-Chair Position Confirmed – For Information - Leanne Warren a. Brad was re-appointed to the AAC. At the December AAC meeting the committee voted that Brad would fill the Vice-Chair position if he were to be re-appointed to the committee. Brad is now the AAC's Vice-Chair.
	 Review of City's Facility Accessible Design Manual (FADM) – For Discussion Leanne Warren Review FADM Exemption Process Plan for situations that are



technically infeasible. The process includes:

- Consultants providing project documents as well as a completed checklist to City project managers and the accessibility coordinator
- A process to work through designs that may not meet the FADM and a subsequent process that may include document a specific exemption(s). The end of this process includes an ad hoc committee made up of one or two AAC members, as well as the project manager, consultant, related project staff and the accessibility coordinator
- A recommendation from the committee to the service area manager/director that funds the project
- The AAC deciding who the representatives will be; potentially pull resources from outside the committee to assist
- b. The Committee recommended that the title of the process, "Exemption process" be reconsidered
- C. In future, Leanne to provide the AAC with a list of upcoming development projects once budgeting has been finalized
- d. Staff Requested Additions to the manual: Fire Stations and EMS facilities
- 3. Accessible Integrated Standard What is next for 2012 For Information Leanne Warren
 - a. City of Guelph website has all emergency and public safety information in accessible text format
 - b. Employee Workplace emergency information policy was developed along with an intake style of form. A notice was sent out to all employees with their paycheques in December.
- 4. Affordable Bus Pass Pilot Program Update Lynne Briggs
 - a. The application form for the affordable bus passes has been develop and an AAC member who supports people who may use the service and an AAC member who may use the service have provided comment
 - b. The pilot starts in July; applications available in February and promoted to those who currently access the subsidized bus pass program.
