Review of Action Items from Previous Meeting:

1. "The committee recommends that the City uses the University to analyze the data of rejected loads from the organics plant to help with promotion and education targeting."

The City met with the University to discuss this and analyse the data, the city will follow up with collections and continue to monitor, did not need further input from the University due to the small amount of contaminated material.

2. To draft a report for the next meeting in March, taking into account comments received on the initial draft report to "To provide a summary of the work of the committee for the current council term (2014-)"

The City shared the draft report, will send round a copy for final comments within the next week. Will be submitted at the end of the Month.

3. To follow up on email from resident about becoming a committee member, Ken Spira to provide City with email correspondence.

Ken had sent the email, the City had contacted the resident and received an application, this had been submitted to the Committee co-ordinator, and it will follow due process.

4. To discuss the terms of reference for the committee with the MOECC with respect to length of time a committee member may serve.

The City had spoken with the MOECC and they had no opinion on the matter, the MOECC mandates there be a committee, terms of reference are a matter for the City.

5. Review 2017 odour complaints to see if they are happening further away from site.

Review of 2017 complaints revealed there were no patterns of the complaints being received further from the site.

6. The City to provide information on the roughed in afterburner for the stack emissions.

The City provided further information and a drawing showing where the afterburner was due to be roughed in on the site.

7. Confirm run-off from organics asphalt pad is tied into the sanitary sewer system on site.

Ken provided some site drawings of the new PDO area and there was discussion around the potential for run off from a fire from that area. There was also discussion around where the water would go from the asphalt pad on the west side of the organics maturation hall, it was re stated this water would go into the lined ponds and then into sanitary.

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8. To look at responses to questions 10 and 11 from the 2016 Annual report questions about the leaf and vard waste and diversion and provide clarity. The City discussed both questions with Ken, for question 10, the City will be removing some text from the annual report and question 11 was answered by explaining that we didn't record all outgoing material as specific quantities. Delegations wishing to be heard regarding matters on the agenda: 5 None Matters arising from the Delegations: 6 None **New Business:** a) Organics Facility update on operations. From Saturday 6th January 2018 until Friday the 13th April 2018 the plant has processed 9022.45 tonnes of Source Separated organics. The facility has shipped out 2659.77 tonnes of finished compost in this time. The amount of screening waste from the plastics bin leaving the facility in this time frame is as follows: Screening waste- plastics bin- 112.45 tonnes Screening waste plastics bin as a percentage of incoming source separated organics is 7 1.25%. There have been 5 rejected loads in this time period. Contaminated with blue box material Facility has been running taking waste from the City of Guelph and the Region of Waterloo in this 3 month timeframe. b) Overview of odour complaints since January 11 2018 meeting There have been no odour complaints since the last plc meeting. Total incoming material to site The total incoming material to the site in the time period 8th January to 14th April 2018 was 29441.59 tonnes, the outbound material from the site was 210174.28 tonnes. Taken from Geoware on the 19th April 2018.
