	a) Organics Facility update on operations.				
	From Monday 26 <sup>th</sup> June 2017 until Friday the 22 <sup>nd</sup> September 2017 the plant has processed 8514.31 tonnes of Source Separated organics.				
	The facility has shipped out 1725.72 tonnes of finished compost in this time.				
	The amount of screening waste from the plastics bin leaving the facility in this time frame is as follows:				
7	Screening waste- plastics bin- 136.68 tonnes				
7	Screening waste plastics bin as a percentage of incoming source separated organics is 1.61%.				
	There has been one rejected load in this time period. Contaminated with blue box material				
	Facility has been running taking waste from the City of Guelph and the Region of Waterloo in this 3 month timeframe.				
	b) Overview of odour complaints since June 29 2017 meeting				
	There have been 21 odour complaints on 13 days since the last plc meeting.				
	There have been 21 buour complaints on 13 days since the last pic meeting.				

## Total incoming material to site

The total incoming material to the site in the time period 26th June 2017 to the 24th September was 34448.22 tonnes, the outbound material from the site was 23966.31 tonnes. Taken from Geoware on the 25th September 2017.

## Spills on site

No spills or fires on site in the last 3 months.

# Update on biofilter works

The Ecolo unit was fully installed on the 30<sup>th</sup> June 2017. Work has been undertaken through July to optimise the settings. On the 9<sup>th</sup> August, the solution was altered to try and reduce the odours in the local neighbourhood.

Work continues to be ongoing with the weather system that drives the system.

Sampling of the biofilter media took place in July and then again in early September, we await the results of the September samples to see if the pH has been altered in the beds, following the installation of ducts and secondary mist eliminators.

There is a meeting between the various partners in the Organic waste processing facility taking place on October 11<sup>th</sup>, the plc will be informed at the next meeting of the next actions.

# Updates on Waste Free Ontario Act with respect to Organics, batteries, used tyres and blue box

Food & Organic Waste Stakeholders Committee:

Last meeting: Sept 14.

Focus on what MOECC envisioned as Policy Statement and Action Plan pieces.

Included a ppt by MOECC on Food Waste Reduction.

Most controversial: compostable products & packaging.

#### Batteries:

Stewardship Ontario has reached its target of 45% diversion and consequently is not accepting any new programs for payment.

Also, major processor not being funded either due to reaching target.

Of concern by municipalities as this is not in the spirit of the new Waste Free Ontario legislation and may set a precedent re: targets under the EPR programs under Blue Box.

#### **Used Tires:**

Municipalities working together under AMO, RPWCO, MWA & City of Toronto (4 partners) to receive payments dating back to 2015.

Consultant hired by 4 partners at suggestion of RPRA to resolve the impasse.

Consultant researched & reported on findings in letter sent to Ontario Tire Stewardship. OTS Board quit en masse Sept 19<sup>th</sup> citing that they could not work with the wind up plan as proposed by RPRA.

This may be good news for payments because PTS will be put under a Public

Administrator, who may be more conducive to our claims.

OTS meeting held Sept. 25<sup>th</sup> with stakeholders.

Payment per tire being reduced from 88¢ to 50¢.

Some haulers and processors not being paid by OTS either.

#### Blue Box:

4 partners and Stewardship Ontario sent a letter to the Minister requesting that the BBPP transition be fast tracked (municipalities potentially will save \$130M/year), & Minister agreed.

Municipal 3Rs Collaborative working hard on this file, communications via AMO website (portal with all relevant public documents – M3RC, municipal reports, etc.), in person workshops, meetings with MOECC staff, etc.

Stewardship Ontario starting "meaningful discussions" with stakeholders Oct. 4<sup>th</sup>.

# **Answers to 2016 Annual Report Questions.**

The City had answered the questions Ken had provided, he had asked some supplementary questions which will be answered in due course. We did discuss questions 1 and 3 in more detail.

Question 1 was that the material had been taken in from Simcoe due to a fire in Hamilton where the material usually goes. Our ECA does allow us to accept material from them.

# Question 3

The rejected loads are all from the City of Guelph. The committee felt it would be worth investigating in more detail where in the City the contaminated material came from. The committee made a motion:

"The committee recommends that the City uses the University to analyze the data of rejected loads from the organics plant to help with promotion and education targeting."

This was passed unanimously.

Update on biofilter work, odor complaints since completion, overall odor control system review and next steps.

Update on Solid Waste Services Negative Variance since the November 7<sup>th</sup> report to City Council.

One of the outcomes of the negative variance report was that solid waste would be one of the first departments to undertake the business service review process. This had been taking place in 2017 and the interim report had been released on the 7<sup>th</sup> September 2017 and there had been a special council meeting on the 18<sup>th</sup> September 2017.

The committee asked if they could be sent more information on all this, the City said it would oblige.
