The staff report is to provide Council with information and to seek direction for staff to proceed into negotiations with a potential eligible tourism entity for the purpose of developing an agreement to implement a Municipal Accommodation Tax on all transient accommodations within the City of Guelph.
	The committee asked questions surrounding the timeline and next steps of the project if council approves the staff report. Staff advised that if council approves the staff report, the negotiation process will begin soon after with intentions to go back to council with a draft bylaw in 2020. No implementation timeline has been set.
