
Bill 71 Paris Galt Moraine Conservation Act




The Paris Galt Moraine Conservation
Act passed Second Reading
unanimously in the Ontario Legislature
with the support of all Parties.

The Act is largely based on the Oak Ridges Moraine Conservation Act, passed in 2001.

The Act requires the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing to establish a Paris Galt Moraine Conservation Plan.

Objectives of the Paris Galt Moraine Conservation Plan

- Protect the ecological and hydrological integrity of the Paris Galt Moraine Area
- Ensure that the Paris Galt
 Moraine Area is maintained as a
 continuous natural landform and
 environment for the benefit of
 present and future generations



Objectives of the Paris Galt Moraine Conservation Plan

- Maintain, improve and restore all the elements that contribute to ecological and hydrological functions of the Paris Galt Moraine Area, including the quality and quantity of its water
- Consider the cumulative impact of water use and future population growth on water needs



Objectives of the Paris Galt Moraine Conservation Plan



- Ensure that only land and resource uses that maintain, improve or restore the ecological and hydrological functions of the Paris Galt Moraine Area are permitted
- Restrict the extraction of mineral aggregates that are below the water table
- Provide for land and resource development that conforms with the objectives of both the Plan and any applicable Ontario climate change plan

Paris Galt Moraine Conservation Act

The Paris Galt Moraine Conservation Act does not prevent growth, development, job creation or business investment.

This Bill is about creating the best conditions for responsible development, while protecting the moraine and its ecological services.
