The City will be hosting a planning and design charrette, including a series of public workshops, open houses and information sessions, which will lead to the creation of a preferred plan for the area.



Through the planning and design charrette an implementable preferred community structure will be created—one that reflects good planning and input from the community and stakeholders. There will be multiple opportunities for you to provide input into the preferred community structure.

Following the Public open house on April 9, there will be a presentation to City Council beginning at 6:30 p.m.

Charrette outcomes

At the end of the charrette, it is intended that the following will be developed:


- a land use plan including preliminary density ranges;
- collector and arterial road network;
- preliminary and conceptual trail network;
- demonstration plans for three key areas that will include additional detail such as potential local road layouts and block patterns;
- potential park and school locations:
- preliminary water and wastewater servicing concepts with general phasing considerations;
- conceptual stormwater management system including general locations of drainage system elements;
- preliminary high-level grading plan; and,
- illustrative street and trail cross-sections.

All of the work completed through the charrette process will go through a technical review before being presented to Council for approval in June, 2018.

Preliminary or conceptual information related to municipal water/wastewater servicing, stormwater management and mobility will be validated and confirmed upon the completion of technical analysis (including numerical modeling) and consistent with the Master Plan (Approach #1) requirements of the Municipal Engineers Association Class Environmental Assessment (EA) process (Section A.2.7 of the Class EA document-October 2000, as amended in 2007 and 2011) which is an approved process under the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act. This process will include Phases 1 and 2 of the Class EA process to identify a series of related projects/studies necessary to support urban development of this area. In addition this study will be integrated with the Planning Act as outlined in Section A.2.9 of the Municipal Class EA process. This is expected to be completed throughout Phase 3 of the project.

Council Workshop—March 21

Goal: Engage Council in charrette activities

An evaluation exercise of the three alternatives will be completed by Council members. This evaluation will be reviewed with feedback from the public and other stakeholders to inform the development of the preferred community structure. The workshop is for discussion and information purposes only; no decisions will be made at the meeting. The public can observe this session and then provide input at the charrette.

Day 1-April 3

Goal: Affected stakeholders will participate in evaluating the community structure alternatives in order to inform the development of the preferred community structure

To participate in the public workshop exercise, which will focus on evaluating the community structure alternatives, please join us at 7 p.m. for a presentation, followed by a facilitated exercise in smaller groups.

A Public Information Centre, PIC #2, will also be held between 7 and 9 p.m. This drop-in style session will allow you to review project information, ask questions or provide comments to the project team.

Day 2 - April 4

Goal: Synthesize all information received on Day 1 and the evaluation undertaken at the March 21 Council Workshop to inform the creation of a draft preferred community structure

In addition, interested community members and stakeholders are invited to have an individual or small group meeting with members of the project team (City staff and consultants). Interested participants are asked to email the project team at <a href="mailto:clair-m

Day 3 - April 5

Goal: Conduct a series of design exercises in order to refine the preliminary preferred community structure

Technical members of the consultant team and City staff will review the preliminary preferred community structure and work to ensure that it is technically feasible in a series of live design exercises. In the evening, you are invited to join us at 6:30 p.m. for a public information session where we will present the preliminary preferred community structure to receive feedback before it is finalized and presented to Council.

Day 4 - April 6

Goal: Resolve any outstanding issues and start generating charrette deliverables

There are no public sessions on Day 4.

Day 5 - April 9

Goal: Present final charrette deliverables, including the preferred community structure

You are invited to attend the public open house (City Hall, Galleria) between 4:30 and 6:30 p.m. to review the charrette deliverables, including the preferred community structure.

Following the open house, the preferred community design and charrette deliverables will be presented to Council. The presentation will begin at 6:30 p.m. You are invited to attend the Council meeting and/or may provide written or verbal comments on the outcomes of the charrette. This presentation will be for information purposes only and no Council decisions will be made. A council decision on the Preferred Community Structure will be made in June 2018.

The deadline to register as a delegate for the April 9 Council meeting is **April 6, 2018 at 10 a.m.** The final charrette materials will not be available for review ahead of the Council meeting. Interested delegates are encouraged to register based on the preferred community structure presented at the public open house on Day 3 – April 5.
