	 The Guelph Museums Management Report - March 2018 is attached and forms part of these minutes. Tammy Adkin also reported that the second phase of interviews for the vacant Collections and Research Coordinator position will take place next week. Tammy Adkin also commented on the McCrae Coach House project and reported that the project is substantially completed and came in under budget. She added that additional work to the interior galleries and washrooms, exterior fencing and landscaping will also be completed.

• Linda Kearns did not have anything to report.

- Tammy Adkin discussed the January 28, 2018 events recognizing the 100th anniversary of John McCrae's passing. She reported that turnout was good at the churches, the reception at the 11th Field Regiment and for the Hugh Brewster production at the River Run Centre. She added that some McCrae family members were in attendance and pleased by the production.
- Tammy Adkin also discussed the upcoming trip to Belgium and France. She
 discussed the trip itinerary and noted that some invitations to VIPs are still
 outstanding. She added that a young girl from France that had corresponded with
 McCrae House in 2017 will be reciting "in Flanders Fields" as part of the graveside
 commemoration.

6 Community Connections Committee Report

- Jeremy deWaard discussed the youth discussions scheduled for April 9, 2018 and stated that he will discuss the outcome of these discussions at the April meeting of the Advisory Committee.
- Tammy Adkin added that she worked with Adam Rutherford, City of Guelph Youth Coordinator to determine who to invite to these youth discussion.
- Jeremy deWaard also discussed outcomes from the GLAM (Galleries, Libraries, Archives and Museums) summit that Tammy Adkin attended. He added that Tammy met with the local library and art gallery after the conference to discuss such things as job shadowing and group passes.

- Eleanor Ross reviewed the notes and recapped the Febulous! event including that
 the buy-in parties needs more of an upsell at the event, that we need to be more
 selective in the prize donations we collect and more exterior advertising is
 needed. She added that room set up was better this year; however, she found
 the signature drink too strong.
- Eleanor Ross also stated that the Fund a Need appeal went well but a clearer statement of purpose is needed and a package to distribute ahead of the event to businesses could bring in more monetary donations.
- Eleanor Ross added that if the event is to be done again in 2019, planning should start earlier than it did for the 2018 event.

Meeting notes from March 6 2018, Fundraising Committee Debrief

Attendees: Val, Shannon, Linda, Sarah, Tammy, Eleanor, Jayne

Absent: Layne - sent comments:

- we need to increase the gift size and participation.
- need to build our donor/membership base

Numbers

- tickets sold on event brite 60, 19 sold at the door, total attended 78
- Participation Pick a Prize 59, Fund a Need 22, Buy in Party 9, Live Auction 7, Silent Auction - 6
- total revenue was \$11,722, total expenses were \$5,672.45. Net proceeds were \$6,049.55.
 Roughly \$1300 less than last year. Fund a Need brought in \$3,075 at the event with \$1,150 in donations ahead of time.
- In the live auction only A day at the Theatre, Dinner Party at McCrae House, Hot air Balloon and Winter Warm Up went for the assessed value or more. The sports events did not do well.
- In the silent auction only the Wine Basket went for over the assessed value.
- The buy in parties did not do well at all. Dixon's tour had 4, Tai Chi at the Choo Choo had 3 and Brewing Changes Guelph tour had 2

Comments and suggestions

- The decorations were great, bright and playful. Everyone loved the candy on the tables. Suggest a banner on the bridge to get the word out.
- The room set up was good. Maybe turn the heat down ahead of time and fans?
- The food was great. The theme drink was a bit strong. Maybe stick to vacation type drinks
- The pick and pull was great as usual. Keep it at 100 items. Suggest moving it to the glass box.
 This will give more room, increase the flow up and down the hallway and provide an opportunity to decorate with lights etc.
- The fund-a-need had good participation at the event but we need a more clear statement of the need and a package that we can deliver to businesses ahead of time for sponsorship. Suggest moving this to the start of the live auction, not the middle
- Animate the family room to attract people and get them moving around
- We need a better range of prizes and need to have them nailed down further ahead of time so we can promote them.

Questions

- 2019 should we continue with Febulous?
- If yes we need to start much sooner. The fundraising committee needs to meet pre summer.
 Tammy will do a timeline for getting organized much earlier.
