It is tentatively scheduled for late April / early May 2019 and she noted that she is currently reviewing proposals from 2 different tour companies. She reported that Dr. Gil Stelter, a John Galt expert, advised about places they should go in Scotland.</li> </ul>

## 6 Community Connections Committee Report

- The minutes of the meeting of the Community Connections Committee from June 25, 2018 are attached and form part of these minutes.
- Jeremy deWaard reported that the Committee discussed the need cultural diversity at the museum amongst the volunteers and staff to better reflect the cultural composition of the community. All current Advisory Committee members were encouraged to let people they know about the upcoming vacancies on the Museum's Advisory Committee and to suggest to these people that they apply. He added that this same approach could be applied to other volunteer positions.
- Jeremy deWaard also discussed the History Helps program that would involve a team from the museum participating in local charity events to help to show the museum as a caring member of the community. He asked the Advisory Committee Members to look for opportunities for such participation.
- Jeremy deWaard also discussed a History Bites Lunch and Learn program that would be a lunch time lecture to attract downtown workers to the museum. Tammy Adkin added that she will discuss this program idea with Val Harrison, Supervisor of Visitor Experiences.

#### 7 Fundraising Committee Report

- The minutes of the meeting of the Fundraising Committee from June 12, 2018 are attached and form part of these minutes.
- Eleanor Ross noted the importance of planning early for the Febulous! event scheduled for February 2019. She added that the Committee plans on meeting with Layne Way (The Auctionista) in September to review things like prizes, the live auction and sponsorships.
- Eleanor Ross asked all Advisory Committee members to think about sponsorship prospects.
- Eleanor Ross added that in 2018 a year-end appeal for monetary donations to Guelph Museums will be conducted. Tammy Adkin will coordinate this campaign.

## 1. Capital Projects Updates

- Tammy Adin reported that the work in the McCrae Coach House has been substantially completed. She added that work the new fence is still to be completed. She added that the she, along with the Project Manager, the fencing contractor and an arborist have met with the neighbours in regards to the new fence. She reported that it will be a looped wire fence and that the post holes are being dug this week and the fence will be installed in August. She added that the enhancements to the exhibits inside McCrae House will be completed soon. She noted that once the exhibits and fencing has been completed this will complete the capital projects at McCrae House.
- o Tammy Adkin reported that at the Guelph Civic Museum an agreement has been reached with the Basilica on the construction of the exterior scaffolding on the south end of the building and it will be installed in the next week or two. She also reported that the exterior work has progressed very well and is expected to be completed by the end of September at which time the exterior scaffolding will be removed. Tammy Adkin added that the work will then begin in the interior of the glass box area.
- Tammy Adkin reported that a Vimy Oak Tree was planted at the Guelph Civic Museum in honour of author Linda Granfield by her publisher on June 22, 2018. She added that about 17 people were present for the planting and for the special Tea held at McCrae House afterwards.

1	Cultural diversity Discussed the need to increase cultural diversity amongst the volunteer and a staff team at the museum to be better reflective of the cultural composition of the community.  - For the next application for Advisory Committee positions, we will indicate ethnocultural diversity as a desired attribute for the committee and we will share the post with the LIPP, our First Nations, Metis and Inuit advisors, the Young Professionals Network, the Black Heritage Society; we will also conduct interviews with qualified candidates prior to making a recommendation to council  - We will notify the same networks about museum volunteer intake days and job postings
2	History Helps program  This is a concept that was developed five years ago that centres around museum team participation in charity events to build profile of the museum as a caring community partner  - Advisory committee members and staff will be asked to identify such opportunities  - We will use social media to highlight volunteer participation of museum staff and volunteers at other organizations in the community
3	History Bites Lunch and Learn program  This concept was suggested as a lunch-time lecture to attract downtown workers to the museum; we also discussed the potential of doing short outreach activities at downtown restaurants.  - Tammy will ask Val to discuss with Lynn Broughton  - We will target spring of 2019 to launch a pilot event
