
## Centre of The Innovation Corridor

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Your business will have the competitive edge being located at the heart of Ontario's innovation corridor. With easy access to one of North America's largest transportation corridors, Highway 401 is only five minutes from Guelph's Hanlon Creek Business Park. Highway 401 provides direct linkages to the Greater Toronto Area (eastbound) and Waterloo Region (westbound); both within 25 miles (40 km) of Guelph. Guelph's close proximity to major border crossings (90 miles or 150 km) also make it an ideal location for businesses to compete globally.

- Whether it's a major renovation or smaller upgrade, businesses can take advantage of program and incentives that support increasing energy efficieny.
- The four programs are:

Retrofit Program; Process and Systems Upgrade Program; Energy Performance Program; and Energy Manager Program

#### Sewer Credit

- Industrial, commercial and institutional customers who reduce their wastewater treatment needs by at least 25 per cent may qualify for a credit on their bill, paid once a year.
- The credit applies to 75 per cent of the difference between the amount of water used and the amount water sent into the City's sewer system.

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#### Stormwater Credits

- Industrial, commercial, institutional and multi-residential properties of six units or more may qualify for a credit on their stormwater bill.
- Business can get up to 50% off thier stormwater service through the City's credit program
