# **Executive Summary**

#### **Purpose of Report**

To provide quarterly progress update of the active Business Service Reviews.

### **Key Findings**

- The City is currently conducting business service reviews of Solid Waste Resources and Information Technology Service Desk (2499);
- These reviews are pilots for the Business Service Review Framework;
- The quarterly report providing high-level status, as of the end of Q1 2017, is attached;
- A brief status explanation for the review is provided within this report;
- Upcoming reviews include Boulevard Maintenance (estimating to start in June 2017 and Transit Services (estimating to start in late September 2017).

# **Financial Implications**

Third party support will be utilized for the assessment of alternative service delivery options in the Solid Waste Resources review, costing approximately \$150,000.

Community engagement and communications requirements are being reviewed. Costs associated with these activities may range from \$10,000 to \$20,000. These costs will be funded from the Solid Waste Resources' and Project Management Office 2017 approved operating budgets.

There are no financial implications to complete the Information Technology Service Desk (2499) Review.

# Report

The Business Service Review framework was approved in October 2016 (CS-2016-61-Business/Service Review Framework) and in November 2016 (CS-2016-82-Business/Service Review Framework Implementation report) pilot services were identified for review.

A pilot is designed to test methodologies, processes and logistics while gathering information. Pilots help define the best methods and tools and help identify resource and timing needs. Pilots allow staff to spot issues and risks so mitigating activities can be defined for future reviews. Pilots also provide lessons learned to determine what should be repeated as well as what did not work well and needs to be refined, altered to correct.

The pilot business service reviews will examine the relevance, effectiveness and efficiency of the services to ensure resources are allocated to achieve the best outcomes for the City and to support long-term sustainability.

This report is to provide quarterly status update of the active business service reviews to Council.

#### Solid Waste Resources (SWR) Review

#### **Review Scope:**

The specific SWR services that are being reviewed include:

- Waste collection curbside collection, which includes residential, multiresidential, business and commercial collection, yard waste as well as the Public Waste Drop-off;
- Waste processing organic waste processing, Guelph's overall recycling process, operations at the material recovery facility, closed landfill operation, transfer station operation and household hazardous waste processing;
- Material output sale of waste materials, disposal of waste to landfill and reuse of waste materials;
- Administration and customer service customer contact and issue resolution, public education, contract management and compliance.

The following SWR services are not be part of this review:

- Geographic waste collections routes;
- Financial management, including variance reporting, the budgeting process, user fees, financial reserves and development charge funding;
- Enforcement levels as it relates to related bylaws and diversion targets;
- Asset management including fleet and facility infrastructure;
- The Solid Waste Management Master Plan.

#### **Current Status:**

This review is currently in the discovery stage. Activities completed and underway include:

- Boundaries of the review set;
- Scope and objectives defined;
- Current state or "as-is" state of the processes/services documented;
- Communication plan developed and being implemented;
- Collection of data for analysis underway;
- Stakeholders and customers identified and their requirements being defined.

The City of Guelph will work in partnership with Dillon consulting — an impartial, technical expert — to conduct the alternative service delivery assessment portion of the SWR business service review. This will add objective third-party credibility to the review results. Dillon Consulting has a thorough understanding of Guelph's waste services and experience conducting alternative service delivery assessments for other municipalities.

The review will examine two service delivery options for each waste service currently offered:

- In-house City of Guelph staff provide the service;
- Out-sourcing the City owns the service and contracts it out to an external organization.

#### **Information Technology Service Desk (2499)**

#### **Review Scope:**

The 2499 review looks at the process from intake of request to closure of service ticket.

The following are not part of the 2499 review:

- New system/technology, as new service ticket system is being implemented;
- Staff performance or development plans.

This review is currently in the discovery and analysis stages, which includes:



Proposed New Excess Soil Reuse Regulation and Amendments to Existing Regulations	Ministry of the Environment and Climate Change (MOECC)	June 23, 2017	An EBR notice has been posted (013-0299) proposing a new regulation and key complementary regulatory amendments related to the management of excess soil including proposed amendments to the Records of Site Condition Regulation (O. Reg. 153/04). Amendments to the latter will make excess soil management on brownfield properties consistent with and complementary to the proposed excess soil management requirements.  The proposals will have the following goals: to protect human health and the environment from inappropriate relocation of excess soil; and enhance opportunities for the beneficial reuse of excess soil and reduce greenhouse gas emissions associated with the movement of excess soil.	Staff comment will be submitted via the online Environmental Registry (EBR) and provided to Council via the Information Package following the consultation deadline.	Several hundred tonnes of excess soils are being generated and brought to the City every year as a result of infrastructure projects, development projects (subdivision projects), environmental projects etc. As such, it would be in the best interests of the City to provide comments and/or concerns to the MOECC regarding the best use/reuse of the excess soils and to promote efficiency in the (re)development of brownfields located throughout the City.  The City recently was awarded a "2016 Brownie Award" for its "Guideline for the Development of Contaminated or Potentially Contaminated Sites". The City is known for its flexible and practical approach to the development of Contaminated or Potentially Contaminated Sites.  The City's environmental engineering service area was consulted several times by MOECC staff when they were formulating the amendments to O. Reg. 153/04.  The City's new snow disposal facility will also function as a temporary excess soil storage area, and street sweeping storage among other uses. #### West Guelph French Immersion (FI) Boundary Review Re:

As part of the Board's Annual French Review process, Staff confirmed that a new West Guelph FI program will be accommodated at Gateway Drive PS (JK-3 FI) and Willow Road PS (Grades 4-8 FI). At the May 23, 2017 Board meeting, trustees approved the initiation of the West Guelph French Immersion (FI) Boundary Review process to confirm the boundary for this new FI program.

In the Initial Boundary Review Report presented to trustees, there were three (3) possible accommodation options presented. A fourth option was presented to Trustees by staff in response to questions about the proposed new West Guelph FI program.

Options 1-4 recommend the same West Guelph JK-8 FI boundary for Gateway Dr PS/Willow Rd PS. The boundary generally includes the area west of the Hanlon Expressway to the Guelph Woolwich Townline, south of Speedvale/Highway 7 and north of the Speed River. This area is currently assigned to Paisley Rd PS for JK-3 FI and John McCrae PS for Grades 4-8 FI.

Staff has recommended Option 3 in the Initial Boundary Review Report. Option 3 proposes starting the FI program with JK/SK at Gateway Dr PS in 2018/19. Each year following, the program would grow by a grade resulting in the full implementation of the new JK-8 FI program in West Guelph by 2026/27. Option 3 also considers modifying the FI grades currently offered at Paisley Rd PS and the JK FI caps at both Paisley Rd PS and John McCrae PS.

Public input is being sought throughout the review process. A **Public Information Session** is scheduled for June 21, 2017, from 7-9 pm in the gymnasium at Gateway Dr PS. At this meeting there will be a staff presentation of the Initial Boundary Review Report including staff's recommended option and an opportunity for parents/guardians to ask questions and provide feedback.
